What CRCPD Does

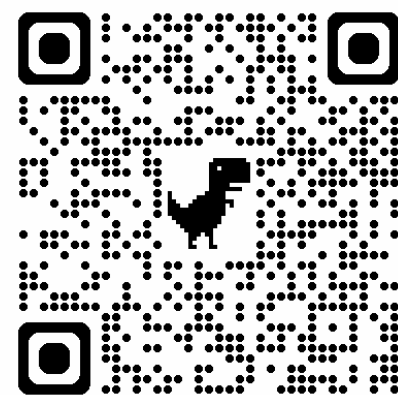
- Maintains a comprehensive directory of personnel responsible for radiological health programs
- Maintains five councils with more than 70 working groups: The Environmental Nuclear Council, the General Council and Liaisons, the Healing Arts Council, the Homeland Security/Emergency Response Council, and the Suggested State Regulations Council.
- Hosts the annual CRCPD conference every May
- Fosters many outreach activities with various Federal partner agencies
- Works closely with the IAEA on various topics (i.e., NORM/TENORM, radon, non-food commodities, standards for radioactivity in foods)
- Maintains Industrial Radiography Certification Program
- Provides assistance with disposal of unwanted radioactive material
- Maintains suggested state regulations for control of radiation and a directory of commercial services

What CRCPD and OAS Both Do

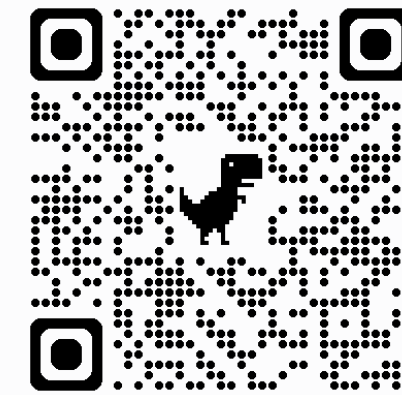
- Participates in the bi-weekly call between NRC/MSST Management
- Briefs the NRC Commission every year
- Provides positions, comments, and resolutions affecting the NMP community
- Presents at each other's annual meeting/conference and attends each other's board meetings

What OAS Does

- Supports the NMP by representing the interests of the Agreement States (AS)
- Assists AS with licensing reviews, inspections, training, and sealed source and device reviews
- Mentors new Radiation Control Program Directors
- Selects volunteers to represent the AS on various working groups and early involvement in NRC rulemaking
- Consolidates States comments on NRC documents
- Finds AS representatives to be on the Management Review Boards and to become IMPEP Team Leaders in training
- Hosts NMP Champion Chats
- Hosts the OAS NMP annual meeting every August
- Participates in government-to-government meetings
- Looks after the wellbeing of the State radiation control programs
