Integrated Materials Performance Evaluation Program (IMPEP)

For Fiscal Year 2019



- 10 IMPEP reviews conducted (one remaining)
- Six associated
 Management Review
 Boards (MRBs) completed
 (three remaining)
- Three MRBs scheduled for the remainder of FY19

The reviews included Agreement State personnel filling 17 team member slots.

Current Status

Adequacy and Compatibility

- All Agreement State Programs are Adequate to Protect Public Health and Safety with three needing improvement
- 35 of 37 Agreement State Programs have a finding of Compatible with the NRC's program

Current Heightened Oversight/Monitoring

- 1 materials program on heightened oversight
- 1 materials programs on monitoring



For the current IMPEP cycle

Overall

 24 of 37 program (65%) – fully satisfactory for all common and non-common performance indicators

Performance Indicators

- 7 of 37 programs (19%) less than fully satisfactory for Compatibility
- 6 of 37 programs (16%) less than fully satisfactory for Technical Quality of Licensing Actions



For the current IMPEP cycle

Performance Indicators

- 3 of 37 programs (8%) less than fully satisfactory for Technical Quality of Incidents and allegations
- 2 of 37 programs (5%) less than fully satisfactory for Technical Staffing and Training
- 2 of 37 programs (5%) less than fully satisfactory for Status of Materials Inspection Program
- 1 of 37 programs (<3%) less than fully satisfactory for Technical Quality of Inspections



Guidance



Fifty-nine procedures managed by the branch

- Management Directive 5.6, 'Integrated Materials Performance Evaluation Program (IMPEP)" was issued on July 24, 2019.
- Fifteen primary State Agreement (SA) guidance documents selected for revision in 1QFY2020.



Compatibility Reviews

- FY 2019 44 regulation and legally binding requirement reviews completed to date including: approximately 101 amendments and 4 legislation reviews.
- Three of the regulation packages submitted were for incorporating NRC regulations by reference.
- Upcoming regulation deadlines:
 - Revisions to Transportation Safety Requirements (10 CFR Part 71), extended to July 2020;
 - Medical Use of Byproduct Material (10 CFR Parts 30, 32 and 35), due January 2022; and
 - Miscellaneous Corrections Organizational Changes (10 CFR Parts 37, 40, 70, and 71), due December 2021.



- **Update will commence 1QFY2020**


