






• W.S. § 35-11-2004(c)

Prior to terminating a byproduct material license the department shall ensure the ownership of a disposal site and the byproduct material resulting from licensed activity are transferred to

(i) The state of Wyoming

(ii) The federal government if the state declines to acquire the site, the byproduct material, or both the site and byproduct material





Lesson Learned Number 4 Be Careful, Small Items May Become Larger



Article VIII A

1. This Agreement will terminate without further NRC action if the State does not amend Wyoming Statute Section 35–11–2004(c) to be compatible with Section 83b.(1)(A) of the Act by the end of the 2019 Wyoming legislative session. Upon passage of a revised Wyoming Statute Section 35–11–2004(c) that the NRC finds compatible with Section 83b.(1)(A) of the Act, this paragraph expires and is no longer part of the Agreement.


